A Mother's Calling

Rev. Priscilla Abena Andoh lost both of her parents at a young age. Raised afterward by an aunt who treated her unkindly, she carried that hardship into a lifelong empathy for children with nowhere else to turn.

While on a retreat with her husband, Bishop John Kweku Andoh, in Doryumu — a small town near Shai Hills in the Greater Accra Region — the couple encountered two children begging for alms at a market square. It was the moment that set everything in motion.

What began under a borrowed canopy, with occasional gatherings and whatever food, clothing, or money the couple could share, grew steadily: a five-bedroom apartment, official registration as a foundation for needy children, and in 2015, land of their own in Fianko, on the Bawjiase-Adeiso road. By 2018, a six-bedroom dormitory stood complete — fully equipped with beds, mattresses, and proper bathrooms — and has been home to the children ever since.

Complete with two storerooms — one for food, one for toiletries — and freshly painted, our new kitchen still needs equipping: gas cookers, fridges, deep freezers, microwaves, and washing machines.

Our new dining hall will teach children proper table etiquette, host the widows' skills empowerment meetings, and double as a temporary church for worship and biblical teaching.

LIFTING LIVES

Widows' Vocational Training

In keeping with our motto — lifting lives — we opened our doors to widows in the surrounding community, training them in liquid soap and detergent manufacturing, bead bag and necklace weaving, crocheting, and bakery.



A volunteer from Australia recently spent time training and interacting directly with the widows — a reminder that this program grows strongest with outside hands and hearts pitching in. With your support, we hope to revive and expand it further.

OTHER NEEDS

We are also appealing for a **bus** for the school and home — to safely transport children daily, support educational excursions, and cut down transportation costs — along with **clothing and footwear** for the children in our care.

ALSO NURTURING TALENT

ABCD Academy (Any Body Can Dance) and our **Music Academy** give children creative outlets in choreography, vocal training, and instruments — keyboard, bass, lead guitar, and drums — building confidence alongside skill.
